CWCA promotes self help; seeks and offers individual instruction, tools, and wood supplies; encourages participation in art shows, exhibits, fairs, and demonstrations; and offers monthly informative programs featuring different facets of the craft.

CWCA holds business meetings at The Olympia Center, 222 N. Columbia, Olympia, WA every 3rd Saturday from 10:00AM to 2:00PM. Meetings consist of a planned program related to carving or other member interest subjects (which includes members showing their own projects), a business meeting, a raffle, and refreshments (Pot luck) social time, and an open carving session.
